

YORK SEWER DISTRICT

Trustee Meeting

Mr. Hoyt, Mr. Knowles, Mr. Davis, Mr. McIntire, Mr. Barnett, Chief Utility Officer Philip Tucker and Ms. Walsh were present at the February 11, 2026, meeting.

Mr. Hoyt called the meeting to order at 3:00 PM.

Mr. McIntire moved and Mr. Davis seconded to approve the minutes as amended. U/A

Mr. McIntire moved and Mr. Davis seconded to approve the February monthly bills. U/A

Regarding the financial report, Mr. Davis had several questions on the line items that are over budget.

CUO Tucker went over the list of liens with the Board, stating 34 properties are currently on lien with a handful of them being more problematic.

Mr. McIntire moved and Mr. Davis seconded to move forward with foreclosure process for 4 Reserve Street and 9 Oceanside Ave. U/A

Mr. McIntire moved and Mr. Davis seconded to move forward with foreclosure process if either of the two checks from 41 Flintrock are returned by the bank. U/A

No correspondence for the month.

Mr. Barnett updated the Board on ongoing projects. He informed the Board that we replaced two E1 pumps, one at 7 Wavecrest and the other at 35 Lobster Cove Road. Both were damaged because of freezing. Mr. Barnett informed the Board that the drive on Return #3 needs to be replaced and will cost roughly \$4,000.00. The District has obtained two dewatering mixers from Rochester which we have been trying out and found we are using half as much polymer which is good.

Mr. Barnett provided the Board with pictures and informed them about the vehicle accident Jordan Steves had coming out of Eldredge Lumber parking lot. Jordan was not at fault and the other driver was arrested on scene for driving under the influence and driving with a suspended license. There were no injuries. York Sewer District vehicle was brought to Moody's for an estimate that came in at \$5,000.

Mr. Barnett also updated the Board that the lead engineer from Arcadis is working on how to fit the new blower in the basement.

CUO Tucker discussed the conference in Boston and how he did several presentations and that Darren Lauletta did his first presentation and that he did a great job. He also informed the Board that Nick Volinsky passed his Grade 5 exam which now makes 5 staff that have their Grade 5, one has Grade 3 and one a Grade 2.

CUO Tucker informed the Board that there is not much to update on Donica Road. The District will be hand delivering letters to residents and then it will be presented at the next Selectboard meeting.


